



OCTOBER 2009

- CRIME DATA - Reductions have been seen in all areas. Criminal Damage has decreased by 25%, Rowdy and Inconsiderate Behavior decreased by 18.9%, Anti social Behavior decreased by 12.1%
- Two persons from the Barnsley area have been arrested at a local primary school attempting to break into the premises. They will be charged with the offence.
- Six young men from the Mexborough and Barnsley area were arrested on Moor Road Wath for breaking into a motor vehicle. These persons are on bail for forensic tests.
- A local man subject of an Anti social Behaviour Order has been arrested for a breach of the order. The breach relates to entering educational premises and causing a nuisance. This man has been bailed to the 13th October 2009 to obtain advice from CPS. The Police are confident a charge will be made and will be looking into extending the conditions on the order to cover local educational premises.
- The police have worked closely with the anti social behaviour unit to evict a tenant from an address on Denman Road Wath. The notice to leave the premises related to drug dealing and anti social behaviour from the family in the local area. The case is to be heard at the town hall on the 13th October 2009.
- A local man was arrested for criminal damage on Avenue Road, Wath. The damage related to graffiti on a wall. The man is on bail to the 13th October 2009 where it is anticipated that he will be charged with the damage. The police will also be seeking to obtain an "Alcohol Banning Order"
- The Police have been working with the council Licensing department in the Swinton area after an assault in the area a month ago. The police have increased patrols in this area and have been conducting licensing checks in public houses.
- A group of pupils from Wath Comprehensive School won a national competition for a knife Crime Initiative. The group attended an Awards Ceremony in London on the 23rd September 2009.

THE MONTH AHEAD

- It is anticipated that it will be a busy month ahead. Operation Fawkes will commence from the 23rd October up to the 8th November 2009. During this period the police and community Support Officers will be conducting extra patrols during the evening period to combat any ASB issues. They will be working to prevent an increase in street drinking and firework nuisance.
- The community Support Officers and SY Fire Support Officers have booked schedule of visits into local schools to teach pupils about the danger of fireworks.
- The Community Support Officers will be conducting cycle patrols with the Fire Service in our area.
- The police have been working closely with the Youth Services and have committed to a number of joint events to divert youths away from nuisance behaviour.
