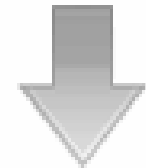

(compared to the same three month period last year)

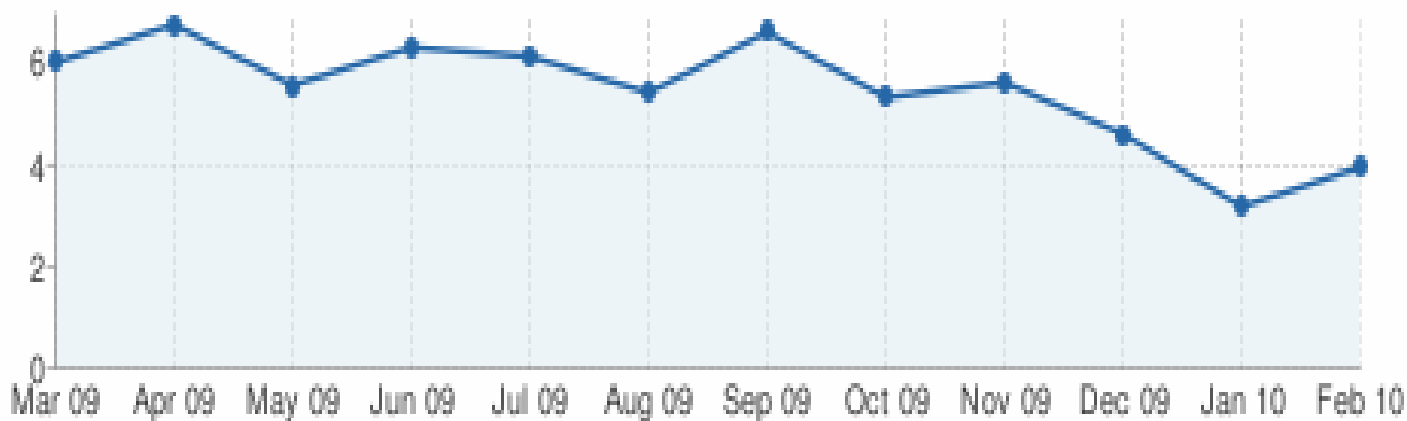

**Priority 1: Lord Conyers Pub, Wales - Loud Music, Disorderly Behaviour by Customers, Involving Noise and Drinking Outside the Pub**

**Priority 2: Lordens Hill, Dinnington – Fly-tipping and Litter around the Old Kwik Save Site**

**Priority 3: Falcoln Park, Nursery Road, Laughton Road, The Interchange, Market Area and Tesco's, Dinnington – Young People Drinking, Littering and Causing Annoyance to Local Residents, Traders and Shoppers**

# We did...

## Priority 1: Lord Conyers Pub, Wales - Loud Music, Disorderly Behaviour by Customers, Involving Noise and Drinking Outside the Pub

- Hours regulated
- Music noise limiter fitted and working
- Door staff employed Friday and Saturday nights
- Back room not been used for late night music events
- Passive drug dog operation conducted on 19.2.10 – several customers searched but no arrests. Licensee very co-operative
- Regular visits by SNT staff and other uniform officers specifically Friday and Saturday nights
- Minor issues identified and passed to RMBC licensing (bottles outside, smoking inside doorway, drunk on premises)
- No reported incidents since adoption as priority

# We did...



## Priority 2: Lordens Hill, Dinnington – Fly-tipping and Litter around the Old Kwik Save Site

- Joint patrols between police and wardens in the area
- Local residents and work contractors asked to report fly-tipping incidents
- The new owner of the site has been served with an enforcement notice by RMBC enforcement officers
- Problems still exist on the allotment area – work ongoing with owners
- Main concrete site now keeping fairly tidy

# We did...



## **Priority 3: Falcoln Park, Nursery Road, Laughton Road, The Interchange, Market Area and Tesco's, Dinnington – Young People Drinking, Littering and Causing Annoyance to Local Residents, Traders and Shoppers**

- A Section 30 Dispersal Order (ASB Act 2003) was introduced on 19.3.10 and is authorised until Friday 14.5.10
- Comprehensive “backroom” process around the order involving Area Assembly, Young People’s Services, Anti Social Behaviour Unit, Rotherham 2010 and the voluntary sector
- Referral, advisory and support services in place (8 to date)
- Enforcement process involving ABC’s, Tenancy enforcement, ASBO’s
- Over 100 interactions to date. Just 23 dispersals.
- Working with Tesco to manage problems there
- Mobile CCTV camera positioned outside the entrance to the store

# We did...



## **Priority 3: Falcoln Park, Nursery Road, Laughton Road, The Interchange, Market Area and Tesco's, Dinnington – Young People Drinking, Littering and Causing Annoyance to Local Residents, Traders and Shoppers**

- Used school texting service and SYP website to provide information on the dispersal order
- Youth Services, JADE and other volunteer workers providing outreach work and using mobile bus on Friday and Saturday nights
- ROC cafe providing extra youth provision on Saturdays at Salvation Army, Silverdales
- Significant reduction in size of groups gathering

# Priorities – April-May 2010

**Priority 1 – Youth Nuisance Falcon Park, Laughton Road area.**

**Priority 2 – Play area off Stoney Bank Drive, Kiveton. Underage drinking, noise and nuisance**

**Priority 3 - Jacky's Lane, Union Street, Co-op and play area, Harthill. Nuisance behaviour.**

Bottle thrown through buss window on Lordens Hill, Dinnington on 26.2.10. Two males have been arrested and released on Police bail pending further enquiries

JCB stolen from Lindrick (twice!). Recovered both times and male from Doncaster arrested and charged with second offence

Travellers on Todwick Road, Dinnington moved on following liaison with RMBC and Yorkshire Forward

Drugs warrant executed at an address in Dinnington. 3 persons arrested for offences in connection with the possession of Class A drugs

Monthly Rogue Trader operations now being conducted and involve using Neighbourhood Watch as ‘eyes and ears’

Three arrested in Dinnington this morning for theft of metal – this type of offence is on the increase again – be vigilant around churches etc.
