## **Community Priority 1 – Reduce the level and fear of crime and increase community safety**

Crime and community safety issues encompassed 5 of the top 10 priorities identified through consultation with Rother Valley West residents. Top of the list of concerns is anti-social behaviour by young people and the resulting criminal damage and fear of crime this engenders. As many of these issues are cross-cutting, initiatives that have been developed in the following action plan often cover more than one priority.

Over the coming year we will

- Work with partners to develop and strengthen multi-agency responses to crime and community safety
- Draw up action plans to tackle hot spots in partnership with communities
- Increase the level of awareness in the community of the work of the SNT and the Neighbourhood Action Group
- Hold Partner and Community together meetings to allow residents to have their say on crime and community safety issues and receive feedback on the work carried out to deal with the issues they have reported.

The damage caused to Ulley Reservoir during 2007 has been of great community concern and people are keen to see it's reinstatement back to full use as soon as possible.
