



WENTWORTH NORTH NEWSLETTER **JULY 2010**

- Wentworth North has continued to see reductions in levels of crime and antisocial behaviour. Crime in general has seen a decrease of 22%. Vehicle crime decreased by 35% . Burglary decreased by 48% . Anti social behaviour decreased .5%.
- The team have distributed crime prevention leaflets to households in Wentworth North. The leaflets related to vehicle security.
- On the 17 June a local male was arrested for two burglaries at Wentworth and Harley. This male was remanded to prison and had been on license for other offences. Since his arrest the spate of sneak in burglaries in Wath has ground to a halt.
- The team have been committed to policing disorder during the world cup period. There have only been a limited number of incidents of disorder during this period.
- Nine Acceptable Behavior Contracts have been served by the Police and Antisocial Behaviour Unit this month. The contracts are designed as an intervention before criminal proceedings are considered. They have been given to juveniles for offences of disorder including incidents at Brampton Church and Brampton fire Station.
- The team have been working with local schools on raising awareness on drink driving. On the 18th June two PCSO'S worked with Wath comprehensive school pupils at Tesco, Wath and Cortonwood Retail Park. They advised members of the public on safe alcohol limits for driving.
- On the 6th July the team conducted an auto crime initiative at Tesco and Cortonwood Retail Park. The officers worked with pupils from Wath Comprehensive school patrolling the car parks to identify vulnerable vehicles. Eighty three vehicles were identified as having valuable items on display whilst the vehicle was left unattended. Letters have been sent to the owners of the vehicles.
- The team have been working with the new Quad bike in our hot spot areas for Motorcycle nuisance. During the last couple of weeks, we have seized eight motorbikes that have been identified as causing a nuisance in the locality.
- The Police and Licensing Department have been working with the Oak Tree public house following a series of complaints from local residents in relation to noise and anti social behavior at the premises. On the 27th June three person were arrested for public order offences. They are on bail till August.
